Thank you for booking the Bowderstone Cottage. Please read the following information carefully to minimise the risk of problems occurring during your visit. We hope that you enjoy your stay!

Receipt of key

The key will be sent to the contact address on your booking form bout two weeks before your stay. Please notify the booking secretary in good time of any change of address.

Please return the key promptly at the end of your visit. Unreturned keys will be removed from the system.

Directions and Parking

Bowderstone Cottage is the larger of the two cottages situated at the Bowderstone, half a mile along a track from the National Trust's Bowderstone Car Park. From Keswick follow the signs to Borrowdale down the B5289. The Car Park is approximately 6 miles south of Keswick on the left hand side, half a mile after the right turn to Grange. If approaching from Honister Pass, the Car Park is approximately 2.5km north of the village of Rosthwaite. You should park in the Car Park, as you cannot take your vehicle along the track to the cottage. The Car Park is pay and display but free if you display a National Trust membership card.

The Cottage

Bowderstone Water Meter

Please note that a water meter has been fitted to the water supply for both the Cottage and the Hermitage. We need to record the water usage against the number of people who have been staying at the hut, along with the bed nights. This information will allow us to calculate the size of the septic tanks and the area required for a soak away. This information needs to recorded accurately for a short period so that the findings can present to the National Trust and Environment Agency.

I have created a document which is pinned to the Cottage notice board and need people staying in the hut to record the meter reading at the beginning of their stay, number of people, bed nights and meter reading at the end of the stay.

The meter can be found round the back of the Cottage kitchen, up by the water header tank, round the back of the large tree.



The cottage comprises the following accommodation:

Dormitory – The room comprises a 3-tier Alpine-style bunk that can accommodate up to 18 people. There is one mattress for each sleeping place. No bedding is provided so each member of your party should bring **a sleeping bag.**

Common Room –The room is equipped with tables, chairs and benches. Useful information for your stay can be found on the notice board and in the leaflets provided.

Kitchen _There are 8 electric rings a microwave, fridge and a sink with hot and cold water. There is adequate cutlery and crockery and utensils for 18 people. Tea towels are not provided so bring your own.

Toilet and Washing Facilities _There are separate men's and women's flush toilets and hand basins with hot and cold water. A shower is located in the women's toilet. The toilets empty into a septic tank. Therefore, please do not dispose of sanitary towels, tampons, toxic liquids or any other items, other than toilet paper, down the toilets. They should be disposed of with your other rubbish.

Water Supply _Water siphons down a pipe from a mine up the hill at the back of the

cottage. The water quality is checked every six months.

Lighting - Electric light is provided in all rooms.

Heating _ There is an electric storage heater in the lobby between the toilets and another in the bedroom. Please do not adjust them or use them as drying devices. The dormitory and common room have open fires. Coal is supplied throughout the year and is stored behind the kitchen. You are advised to bring kindling and firelighters. Ashes must be dumped on the ash tip behind the kitchen. *In the interests of the local ecology, you must not use fallen timber or cut down branches or trees for fuel.*

Dehumidifier – The age and usage pattern of the Cottage make in very prone to damp. To counter this a dehumidifier has been installed in the Common Room. Please do not switch it off.

Security – Please ensure that all windows and doors are securely locked when your party goes out for the day. The Bowderstone is a popular tourist attraction and you are therefore advised not to leave valuable items in the cottage.

Behaviour of Group Members

At all times please ensure that group members consider the needs of local residents, other tourists and the environment. Limit

noise, particularly after 11pm, treat the cottage facilities with respect and follow the Country Code.

No Camping

Camping is strictly forbidden by the National Trust to whom the cottage and adjacent land belongs.

NMC Members Cottage _ The Hermitage

The small cottage, called the Hermitage, is situated just 20 metres from the Bowderstone Cottage. It is for use of NMC members only. It has no toilet or shower facilities so members using the Hermitage share those of the cottage.

Pricing Policy

The NMC has adopted the following pricing policy for the cottage:

The basic cost is £7 per person per night.

A night is 6 pm to 6 pm the following day.

The minimum number for which a booking will be taken is 4.

The minimum charge for the cottage is £30 per night.

At weekends preference will be given to groups booking both Friday and Saturday nights.

Groups booking and paying for 14 places will have sole use of the cottage.

All places booked must be paid for. In the event of cancellation less than 14 days before the start of the booking, the full number of places booked must be paid for.

A deposit of 50% of the fee or £30 (whichever is the **greater**) must be paid with the booking form.

The key should be returned with the balance of the fee due.

Arrival Checklist

On arrival please:

Unlock the door using the electronic key provided

Sign and date the visitors book, listing the names of all those in your party. This establishes your right to a bed space. Check water supply is working before using toilets, water heater and shower.

Departure Checklist

On departure please:

Ensure that workbenches, sinks, stoves, shower and toilets are clean.

Wash, dry and put away all dirty dishes and pans.

Defrost fridge and prop door open.

Turn off cookers and the two water heaters in the toilet at the mains.

Left over food and other refuse attracts vermin. Take all surplus food and drink home with you and remove all refuse. Plastic sacks

are provided for this.

Clean fireplaces and put ash on the ash tip.

Sweep all floors.

Stand all mattresses on their sides.

Make sure all the lights are off.

Leave storage heaters on as they work on a timer.

Leave water on unless otherwise instructed.

Leave dehumidifier on unless otherwise instructed.

Ensure the Cottage is clean and tidy throughout.

Take all your belongings with you.

Securely fasten all windows and shutters.

Lock the door

Telephones

The nearest public telephones are in Grange and Rosthwaite. Mobile phone reception in the Lake District is patchy but you can usually get a signal at the Bowderstone if you stand on top of Bowderstone itself or on the rock with the standing stone behind the small cottage. There is also usually a signal part way down the track towards Rosthwaite. **Emergency Services**

Obviously you need to dial 999 for emergencies. This is also the means of contacting the Mountain Rescue Service. For less critical incidents the following information might be useful:

Keswick Police Station, Bank Street, Keswick. You should phone 01900 602422 and ask for Keswick Police.

The hospital has a minor injuries unit.

Public Transport Services

Borrowdale can be a nightmare to drive through but it possible to access many of the high peaks from the cottage using public transport.

In winter the Borrowdale Rambler, Service 79, runs hourly from Keswick to Seatoller and back starting around 7.30 am until 9.30 pm weekdays and 9.30 am to 6.30 pm on Sundays. In summer this service increases to half hourly. Check timetables in the cottage or at bus stops.

The Derwentwater launches run clockwise and anticlockwise around the lake. The nearest landing stage to the cottage is at Lodore and there are stages down the sides of the lake close to the fells as well as one in Keswick. There are three a day each way in winter. This increases in frequency in the summer. Check timetables in the cottage or at Keswick landing stage.

Local Services

Foot and Mouth Disease has hit businesses in Borrowdale hard. Please help the economic recovery of the area by using as many local services as you can during your stay. Keswick has many cafes and pubs and a wide range of shops selling everything from groceries and chemist goods to outdoor clothing, books and gifts. Nearer to the Cottage are the villages of Grange, Rosthwaite, Stonethwaite and Seatoller each with their own pubs, cafes and shops. Details of some local services are given below and also in the reference folder at the Cottage.
