



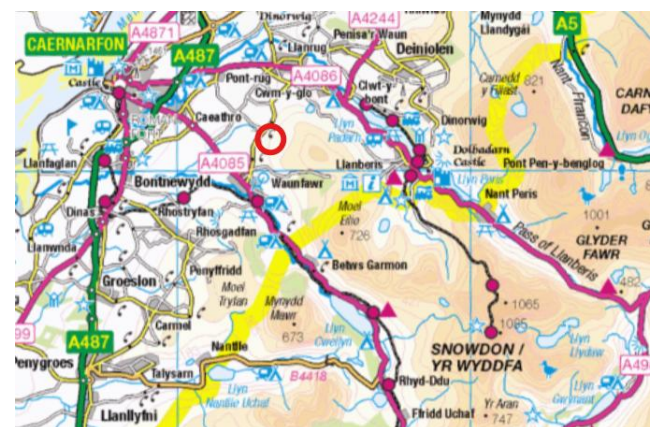
MKMC Meet 22nd-24th January 2027 Llanberis

The Chamois Mountaineering Centre is located at Ceunant in Snowdonia (10 minutes from Llanberis by car). It was originally the purpose built residential accommodation for the engineers who worked at the Marconi wireless telegraph station. It is situated on the North Westerly slopes of the Snowdon massif at 230m above sea level with fine panoramas of Anglesey and Llyn peninsula. We have initially booked 20 of the 43 beds and can book more if the meet is popular.

Cost of the weekend: £36 for two nights, plus optional £2 per trip sustainability surcharge. Please pay your money into our Club bank account, sort code 30-15-53, account 01971285. Please include your name and 'Jan27' as a reference. Email trip organiser and the treasurer to let them know you have paid.

The Chamois Centre is within easy reach of the popular hill walking areas such as the Llanberis Pass, Ogwen and Beddgelert and is ideally situated for any group wishing to walk, mountaineer or climb in the mountains of Snowdonia. The centre forms an excellent base for rock climbing at areas such as the slate quarries, the Llanberis Pass and Tremadog.

The hut is on Ordnance Survey Explorer map OL17, but you may also want to look at OL18, OL22 and OL23. Also, Harvey's Snowdonia North or Harvey's/BMC Snowdon.

Public Transport

It is possible to travel to Caernarfon using public transport, by train from MK to Bangor, via either Manchester or Wolverhampton, then onwards to Caernarfon by bus. The trip to Bangor can be achieved in under 4 hours, but the bus to Caernarfon is very slow, so a lift from an accommodating club member may be required for the last part of the journey. Trains and buses are infrequent, so please do your research and check the timetables if you want to take this option.
